

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
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PROJECT HISTORY Numerous requests for water service from various areas of the town


• Requests for pricing on extensions to different areas

 Town of Mendon/Monroe County Water Authority Roles



- Reliable & Potable source of water
- Hydrants allow for reduced insurance rates due to enhanced fire protection
- Properties with public water tend to be easier to sell
- Wells can have water quality issues, which may require treatment (higher contamination possibility)
- Wells can cease to produce water at any given time, particularly in dry/drought conditions
 - The cost of a new well can be high



Benefits of Public Water Supply

MONROE COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY ROLE

- Retail Lease Agreement with Town
 of Mendon
 - Operation and Maintenance
 - Water production, treatment, and distribution
 - Assistance during design/construction
- New Services
 - Existing well supplies
 - Connections to public water systems





WATER DISTRICT FORMATION

Method 1: Petition

- >50% of the Assessed Valuation (AV) must sign in agreement, <u>and</u>
- >50% of the Resident Owners Assessed
 Valuation (AV) must sign in agreement
- Petition → Notice → Public Hearing →
 Town Board Resolution → Comptroller
 Approval* → Town Board Action

Method 2: Resolution

- Town Board creates district by Board Resolution
 - Subject to Permissive Referendum

*Comptroller Approval is needed if the total debt and commodity charges are over \$904 per year**


**Comptroller threshold changes annually according to the average of approved districts from the previous years



OTHER OPTIONS: INDIVIDUAL DISTRICTS

- Smaller districts may be created by road or area (i.e., Smith Road)
- The same method to extend water infrastructure must be followed for smaller districts
- Water may need to be extended to the area requesting service
