F.Y.I.

1. Highway Department personnel commenced the brush pick up on April 30, 2018. After 2 weeks, they have hit the midway point the imaginary half way point. Everything east of West Bloomfield Road has been picked up. There is a lot of brush due to the wind storms prior to the 30th.
2. The results of the water samples are in. It appears that the effluent from the oil and water separator will be acceptable to the Canandaigua Treatment Plant for disposal.
3. I have met a few more times with Board Member Mike Roberts to discuss ideas for Hamlet decorations, ie. planters, hanging baskets, banners, etc.
4. We have received notification that the Town of Mendon will receive the following funds from New York State for road work, and/or related work:

CHIPS:	\$69,947.86
PAVE NY:	\$15,966.30
EXTREME WINTER RECOVERY:	\$12,322.54
5. Highway personnel assisted with the insulation work at the Community Center. Insulation was pulled back from the eaves and baffles were put in place. This is in preparation for additional insulation.
6. As a part of the cleanup of the roads, and compliance with storm water guidelines, the roads were swept. A rental sweeper was utilized for the work under Monroe County bids.
7. With assistance from the Mendon Fire Department, portions of the Hamlet sidewalks were cleaned of accumulated debris.
8. Cross culverts were replaced on Assembly Drive and Hopper Hills. The metal culverts had failed and needed replacement. This is a sign of the aging of housing developments. Unfortunately, installation of metal culverts was the standard 20 or 30 years ago, and now they are starting to fail.
9. American flags have been placed in the Hamlet, along with installation of a few more. The military banners have also been put in place.
10. A tree fell on Mendon Center Road onto the wires. The highway superintendent assisted with the removal of the tree, once it had been removed from the wires. A second tree fell a few days later on Clover Street, a state road. Mendon Highway personnel removed that tree, at the request of the fire department, in order to get the road open.

11. Highway crews also picked up debris that had accumulated over the winter. This was conducted on Town roads.
12. Soccer nets and tennis nets have been put in place, fields have been mowed and groomed in preparation for summer use. Semmel Park tennis courts remain closed, but the courts at Mendon Center Park are open.
