

Data represents mutual aid units given or received, broken out into categories for mutual assistance or mutual aid. Mutual assistance represents standing mutual aid agreements for other departments to be dispatched to an incident depending on the criteria (often STRUCTA, or working fire notifies). Regular mutual aid represents requests from an incident commander to start extra units from another department to assist with the workload at a previously dispatched incident. Unfortunately these two criteria are often confused or incorrectly entered into incident reports, which may lead to inaccurate data distinguishing between automatic aid and mutual aid. For this reason it is more appropriate to look at the total breakdowns of given and received aid for the Honeoye Falls Fire Department. Furthermore this chart represents units of mutual aid. Whereas we generally only send one unit of mutual aid to other districts, we count each responding department as a mutual aid unit when aid is received. This is best represented in the 2022 data set by the 700 pine trail fire where 7 other departments responded, representing 7 of the 32 units for that year's total mutual aid received value.
